HB 4001	No Priority	Requires Director of Oregon Department of Administrative Services to study development and administration of program to make payments to essential workers for services performed during COVID-19 pandemic and report findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to labor on or before September 15, 2023.
HB 4002	No Priority	Prohibits employers from permitting or requiring agricultural workers to work in excess of maximum allowable hours unless workers are compensated for overtime hours worked.
HB 4015	No Priority	Modifies eligibility requirements for entrepreneurial development loans.
HB 4040	No Priority	Appropriates moneys to Oregon Business Development Department to develop and implement program to award grants to Oregon cultural organizations in response to negative impact of COVID-19 pandemic on organizations' earned revenue.
HB 4048	No Priority	Directs Oregon Business Development Department to conduct market analyses of certain emerging economic sectors.
HB 4055	No Priority	Extends privilege taxes on merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands.
HB 4059	No Priority	Redefines "large-scale project" for purposes of contractor labor standards.
HB 4063	No Priority	Requires Oregon Business Development Department to conduct pilot program with three jurisdictions within this state to study and make recommendations concerning administrative processes and procedures used in approving residential construction projects.
HB 4069	No Priority	Prohibits discrimination in places of public accommodation on basis of person's medical history.
HB 4079	No Priority	Establishes Oregon Freedom Pilot Program in Department of Human Services to provide monthly stipends to low-income families.
HB 4086	No Priority	Amends provisions of workers' compensation law related to beneficiaries.
HB 4094	No Priority	Exempts receipts from sales of prescription drugs and medical supplies or from provision of medical services from commercial activity subject to corporate activity tax.
HB 4104	No Priority	Establishes Prosperity 10,000 Program to provide career coaching, occupational training and job placement services for at least 10,000 low-income job seekers most impacted by COVID-19 pandemic.
HB 4118	No Priority	Allows city to expand its urban growth boundary, or to require Metro to expand its urban growth boundary, in order to include land designated as urban reserve that supports workforce housing and commercial development supportive of workforce housing if certain conditions are met.
HB 4138	No Priority	Amends provisions of workers' compensation law related to payments of benefits, notice to workers, recovery of overpayments and errors in claims processing.

HB 4141	No Priority	Establishes timeline for restrictions on sales of petroleum diesel for use in motor vehicles.
HB 4144	No Priority	Prohibits Oregon Transportation Commission from establishing or assessing toll on Interstate 205 unless toll used to pay for construction of additional lanes.
HB 4151	No Priority	Authorizes self-service dispensing of Class 1 flammable liquids at retail dispensary.
SB 1507	No Priority	Exempts receipts from sales of prescription drugs, feminine hygiene products, diapers and baby formula from commercial activity subject to corporate activity tax.
SB 1513	No Priority	Prohibits employer from taking adverse employment action against employee employed in certain manufacturing establishments who refuses to work mandatory overtime shift unless employer has provided employee with at least two weeks' advance notice of overtime shift.
SB 1514	No Priority	Requires Director of Employment Department to study financial stability of Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund and report findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to employment on or before September 15, 2023.
SB 1515	No Priority	Modifies definition of "benefit year" for purposes of paid family and medical leave insurance program.
SB 1516	No Priority	Prohibits public bodies and private entities from requiring person to receive COVID-19 vaccination or to possess COVID-19 immunity passport, immunity pass or other evidence certifying COVID-19 vaccination or immunity status.
SB 1518	No Priority	Adds Reach Code to state building code as specialty code and gives power of administration and interpretation of Reach Code to Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services.
SB 1524	No Priority	Modifies provisions of tax laws.
SB 1525	No Priority	Updates connection date to federal Internal Revenue Code and other provisions of federal tax law.
SB 1545	No Priority	Establishes grant programs in Higher Education Coordinating Commission to provide funding for workforce development activities that aim to increase access for priority populations to training opportunities in construction, health care and manufacturing and to workforce development services and benefits.
SB 1565	No Priority	Makes unlawful practice for place of public accommodation to refuse to accept United States coins or currency as payment for goods and services.
SB 1586	No Priority	Clarifies prohibitions regarding provisions that may not be included in agreements between employers and former, current or prospective employees.
